 The status report upto 31.12.2016 is presented in Annexure II.

Points for decision

Members are requested to give their views on the Status Report and suggest follow up action required, if any.

4. Confirmation of the Circular Resolution—Acceptance of bid for selection of agency for wildlife research through e-tender

Resolution no.2 dt 24.11.2016 with regard to Acceptance of bid for selection of agency for wildlife research under the Biodiversity Conservation component was circulated to the members of G.B with a note by the CPD WBFBC Project. The important points of the note are given below.

- (a) E-tender was invited for selection of agency to conduct study on Ecology of Tiger in North Bengal. The first e-tender failed due to single bid. Against NIT No. WBFBCP/NIT-13(e)/2016-17 (2nd call), four bids were received.
- (b) The final result was arrived at by an Evaluation Committee on the basis of Quality cum Cost Based Selection (QCBS) (80Technical:20Financial) as per JICA norms. The final result of QCBS is given below:

The bidder securing highest mark in QCBS, i.e Aranyak, was selected for the assignment. The quoted rate of Aranyak is Rs. 54,73,710/- (Rupees Fifty four lakhs Seventy three thousand Seven hundred ten) only

(c) Since as per the Delegation of Financial Power under the Operation Manual of the Society the limit of the CPD is Rs. 50.00 lakhs only the proposal was circulated for acceptance by the members of the G.B.

Majority of the members agreed with the following resolution:

"Resolved that the offer of Aaranyak @ Rs.54,73,710/- (Fifty four lakhs Seventy three thousand Seven hundred ten) only inclusive of all taxes, for the purpose of study on Ecology of Tiger in North Bengal is accepted".

Points for decision

Members are requested to confirm their decision of accepting the offer of Aaranyak as mentioned in the circular resolution.

5. Amendment of provision of operation of Bank account of JFMCs

Following provisions are laid down in para 10.12: Accounts at JFMC / EDC level, of the Operation Manual of the Society:

- (a) Existing savings bank account of the JFMC/EDCs should be used for operating the 'Community Development Fund' for development of Community Infrastructure and allied activities.
- (b) A second savings bank account shall be opened as 'Revolving Fund' for Income Generation Activities in any Nationalised Bank or in the nearest Gramin bank.

However, it has been observed that

- (i) existing accounts of many selected FPC/EDCs, which are not under FDAs, are not jointly operated by Beat Officer as Member Secretary;
- (ii) in many FPC/EDC area, there are banks which are declared 'at par with Nationalized bank' by Finance Dept.

Points for decision

Relevant portion of para 10.12 of the Operation Manual may be amended as proposed herein below

- (a) A separate account may be opened for 'Community Development Fund' management by the FPC/EDCs, where the existing savings bank account is not jointly operated by Beat Officer as Member Secretary. Such new savings bank account should be operated jointly by the Beat Officer as Member Secretary and a Member of Executive Committee duly authorized by the Executive Committee.
- (b) Savings bank account may be allowed to be opened in banks declared 'at par with nationalized bank' vide Finance Dept., provided nationalized bank is not available in the FPC/EDC area.

6. Operation Manual and Accounts Manual—Proposed inclusion of provisions with regard to tax deduction by FPCs/EDCs

Para 7.3 of the Operation Manual provides for Method of Procurement by PMU, DMU and FMU. Procurement by FPC/EDC has not be included in the provisions. Since Community Development funds are likely to be spend for construction purpose or other items by the FPC/EDCs with value more than Rs 1.0 lakh, local tender has to be called by them. Concomitantly, deduction of TDS and/or Cess deposition of the same has to be done as per existing statute.

However, FPCs/EDCs being <u>non-registered bodies</u>, <u>deduction and deposition of TDS/Cess etc.</u>, <u>will not be possible in tender works.</u>

It is therefore proposed that tender works at FPC/EDC level may be floated by the concerned DMU on their behalf and payment made by DMU to the contractor on satisfactory work completion certificate to be issued jointly by the Member Secretary of FPC and an Executive Committee member to be selected by the Executive Committee. DMU may deduct the applicable taxes and cess and deposit to appropriate heads.

Points for decision

Members may decide on the proposal and give a guideline in the matter.

7. Sanction of fund for Community Development works in DMUs.

As directed by the G.B in 9th meeting, the Community Development works have already been initiated. Though the GB directed to restrict to 50 FPCs only, preliminary training on microfinancing and community development held with the support of BRAIPRD, Kalyani, Govt of West Bengal has been encouraging. Therefore we propose

- (a) to take up Community Development work in about 150 selected FPCs first;
- (b) to step up intensive microfinancing training through BRAIPRD, Kalyani, Govt of West Bengal and to release fund for microfinancing in phases to the FPCS.

It may be informed that the microplans of 530 FPCs/EDCs have been revised and are ready. Based on this the Community Development activities will be taken up immediately. The total budgetary requirement in connection with Community Development and Microfinancing for IGA have been placed DMU wise in Annexure III.

Points for decision

Members ae requested to approve the following

- (i) Community Development in 150 selected FPCs (instead of 50 allowed earlier) will be initiated.
- (ii) Budget allocation for Community Development required to cover all FPCs (600 nos) to the tune of Rs 26,87,31,500/- only (Annexure III).
- (iii) Budget allocation for Microfinancing for IGA Activity required to cover all FPCs (600 nos) to the tune of Rs. 7,50,00,000/- only (Annexure III).

8. Re-allocation of fund provided under wild life equipment of squad for purchase of wildlife squad vans.

Under the Biodiversity Conservation component of the project, one of the items of work is Procurement of Equipment. An amount of Rs.7.61 +3.5 = Rs 11.11 lacs including escalation and contingency has been provided for this item. During a discussion with PCCF Wildlife and CWLW on 16.12.2016, it revealed that fund for equipment for wildlife management is available from other fund sources and therefore the fund provided under the WBFBF Project would be superfluous.

The PCCF Wildlife & CWLW has therefore proposed vide his letter no. 6045/WL/2B-281/16 dt 29.12.2016, that the fund provided for procurement of equipment under Biodiversity Conservation may be utilised for procurement of 2 nos. of Special Utility Rapid Action Mobile Vans (Bolero Camper model) for mitigation of human-animal conflict. PCCF Wildlife has also requested to place the matter before the G.B for concurrence.

Points for decision

Members are requested to concur with the proposal above.

9. Diversion of fund for Maling Bamboo removal and afforestation to Grassland creation in PAs

(a) Discontinuance of Maling Bamboo model for PAs in hills

Under the Biodiversity Conservation component, one of the items of work is Removal of Maling bamboo and creation of plantation in the PAs in hills. It is felt, since Maling bamboo exists in patches and not extensively in the PAs in the hills, creation of

plantation after removal of Maling bamboo proposed under the model of Habitat management of PAs of North Bengal, may not produce any noticeable impact. It has therefore been advised by PCCF WL to discontinue the model.

(b) Enhancement of Grassland and fodder trees plantation

Under the Biodiversity Conservation component, an important item of work of Habitat Management of PAs of North Bengal is Creation of Grassland and fodder trees. Creation of 200 ha of Grassland in North Bengal PAs has created a very positive impact, specially in Jaldapara NP. It has been advised by the PCCF WL to enhance the Grassland creation to the extent possible, out of fund diverted from Maling Bamboo model.

Points for decision

Members are requested to

(i) Concur with the proposals (a) and (b) above.

(ii) Approve the diversion of unspent fund under the Maling Bamboo model to Grassland Creation in PAs of North Bengal.

10. Additional fund required for extension of Aranya Bhavan

A communication was received from the PCCF General stating that additional fund of Rs 90,00,000/- (Rupees Ninety Lakhs) only would be required for vertical expansion of Aranya Bhavan. Vide his letter no. 10513/CS/2M-1023(II)/2015 dt 16.03.2016 PCCF requested for making provision of the additional fund for installation of three elevators for extension of services upto the 8th floor (after vertical expansion). The elevators are 18 yrs old and maintenance of the three lifts has become difficult, since the manufacturer (M/s IBIJI) is almost out of market. Breakdown of the lifts has become a regular feature. The matter was discussed in the 9th GB meeting and following decisions taken:

- (i) the Grant of additional fund of Rs.90,00,000/- (Rupees Ninety lakhs) only for installation of new elevators in Aranya Bhavan is agreed to in principle.
- (ii) The mobilization of additional fund may be explored.

Presently, PCCF (HoFF) West Bengal, vide his letter no8211/P&S(P)/3D-678/16(Vol-

II) dt 9.11.2016 has informed that

(a) some civil work is required to be undertaken for extending the elevators to 8th floor presently under construction under WBFBC Project funding.

- (b) Since the elevator technology has improved in the last two decades, the three elevators operating at present need to be replaced with three new MRL Elevators extending upto 8th floor.
- (c) The total fund required for this additional work is to the tune of Rs1,02,10,280/-(Rupees 1.021 Crores) only.

PCCF (HoFF) has requested to provide the additional fund from either the interest accrued on fund deposited in the account of WBFBC Society or from the Non-reimbursable portion of the project fund.

Points for decision

Members are requested to decide on the proposal placed by the PCCF(HoFF).
