Minutes of the 3rd Meeting of the Governing Body of the West Bengal Forests & Biodiversity Conservation (WBFBC) Society, held on 01.09.2013

The 3rd meeting of the Governing Body of West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation (WBFBC) Society was held on 1st September, 2013 at Aranya Bhavan. The following members attended the meeting, along with the invitees:

A note on each agenda item was distributed to the members present. The members deliberated upon each agenda item and the following decisions were taken:-

1. Confirmation of the minutes of the 2nd meeting held on 25th March, 2013.

Decision: The minutes of the 2nd meeting of the Governing Body are confirmed.

2. Discussion on the Action Taken Report on the Resolutions of the minutes of the 2nd meeting held on 25th March, 2013

No decision needs to be taken on actions already completed. Some of the actions taken required further discussions since modifications and/or suggestions on the earlier taken report were proposed to the Governing Body (G.B.). Discussions on those points and decisions taken thereof are given below:

(i) Revision of composition of Governing Body due to changes in the posts

As per the decisions taken in the 2nd meeting, the PCCF, HoFF has sent a proposal to Forest Dept to empower Addl. PCCF North Bengal to look after Social Forestry works of the State. The Member Secretary of the G.B sent a proposal to Forest Dept requesting certain changes in



the composition of the G.B as per the decisions taken in the 2nd meeting. Further discussions were held on the proposals and the following decisions were taken:

Decision:

- (a) The post of Addl PCCF looking after Social Forestry, designated in the composition of Governing Body, shall remain unchanged.
- (b) PCCF, HoFF should be re-designated as the Vice Chairperson of the Governing Body of the West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Society. The powers and duties of the Vice Chairperson also have to be defined in the Resolution of the Society.

(c) The PCCF, Research, Monitoring & Development should be included as member in the Governing Body.

(d) Addl PCCF, Finance and Addl PCCF, North Bengal should also be included as members in the G.B. They will be requested to attend the Governing Body meetings as a special invitee, till the resolution of the Society is changed following the formalities under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act.

(e) The posts of Special Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal, Finance Dept and Special Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal, Forest Dept in the G.B. composition, should be replaced with Special Secretary/ Additional Secretary/ Joint Secretary/ Financial Advisor, Finance Dept or Forest Dept, as the case may be, to be nominated by the concerned administrative department.

(ii) Approval of the Operations Manual—approval of recruitment and services rules

In the 2nd meeting of the Governing Body, it was decided that a proposal should be sent by the Society, with regards to the Performance Appraisal System to Forest Dept, in line with the existing rules and procedures. It was apprised by the Chief Project Director that the proposal would be submitted, through the PCCF, HoFF, after creation of the posts (of PMU) within the Society.

<u>Decision</u>: The proposal should be submitted by the Chief Project Director, WBFBC Project to the Addl PCCF, HRD after the notification of the creation of posts within the Society.

(iii) <u>Approval of the Operations Manual—approval of draft notification of PMU and DMU/FMU</u>

Chief Project Director informed that as per the approval of the GB in its 2nd meeting, the Society has notified the establishment of 32 DMUs and that the accounts of 26 DMUs have been opened in various nationalized banks as per the resolution of govt.

Decision:

- (a) The accounts should be opened preferably in State Bank of India, or United Bank of India or Gramin Bank by the DMU/FMU/FPCs
- (b) The PMU should also explore opening of another account in State Bank of India or United Bank of India for facilitating transfer of fund to the DMU/FMU

3. Status Report of the West Bengal Forest & Biodiversity Conservation Project

The Status Report of the Project was placed before the Governing Body by the Chief Project Director of the WBFBC Project. It was appreciated by the members present.

<u>Decision</u>: From the next meeting of the Governing Body the status of the project should be presented DMU wise, showing the physical and financial achievements

4. Engagement of Project Management Consultant (PMC) for the West Bengal Forest & Biodiversity Conservation Project (WBFBCP).

The appointment of consultants under projects financed by ODA Loans from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) was done, following Quality and Cost-Based Selection (QCBS) in accordance with the general principles and procedures laid down in the Guidelines for the Employment of Consultants under Japanese ODA Loans.

The consulting services have commenced with effect from 1st August, 2013. Three experts - Team leader and Forestry expert, GIS & MIS expert and Capacity Building expert - have been mobilized.

(a) Approval for constitution of team for contract negotiation

The PMU took steps to finalize the contract by evaluating the Technical and Financial Bids of the short listed firms, on which JICA conveyed its concurrence and requested to proceed with conclusion of contract with the highest ranked bidder. The Terms & Conditions of Contract, draft of which formed part of the RFP, were finalised by a team for which the names of the following officers were approved by the PCCF, HoFF, W.B. and the Addl. Chief Secretary, Forest Department & the Chairperson, WBFBC Society –

The Governing Body was requested to ratify the constitution of the team as approved by the PCCF, HoFF and the Chairperson of the Society

<u>Decision</u>: The constitution of team above was ratified by the Governing Body.

(b) Authorization to Chief Project Director (CPD) for Signing the Contract.

On receipt of the concurrence of JICA, negotiations for finalizing the Terms & Conditions of the Contract were held with the Consortium of Nippon Koei India Pvt. Ltd., India & Nippon Koei Co. Ltd., Tokyo, Japan, the highest ranked bidder, between 1st July and 3rdJuly, 2013. The minutes of Contract Negotiation, were duly recorded and the final Contract for Consultants' Services between West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Society and the Consortium of Nippon Koei India Pvt. Ltd., India (Lead Partner) & Nippon Koei Co. Ltd., Tokyo, Japan, duly agreed by both the parties, was signed on 03.07.2013.

The concurrence for the Terms & Conditions of the Contract was accorded by the Chairperson, WBFBC Society and the Chief Project Director, WBFBCP was also authorized by him to sign

the Contract on behalf of the Society. The same was placed before the Governing Body of the Society for ratification.

<u>Decision</u>: Ratification, as sought, was accorded by the Governing Body.

(c) Approval for payment of advance to the Project Management Consultant (PMC).

Chief Project Director informed that the Consultant shall carry out the Services in accordance with the provisions of the Contract and the West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Society shall make payments to the consultant not exceeding USD 918,192 (US Dollars Nine Hundred Eighteen Thousand One Hundred and Ninety Two) in foreign currency and INR 96,946,728 (Indian Rupees Ninety Six Million Nine Hundred Forty Six Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty Eight) in local currency.

Also an advance payment of 10% of the contract amount (excluding Price Escalation, Contingency and Service Tax) of foreign currency component and 10% of the contract amount of local currency component (excluding Price Escalation, Contingency and Service Tax) shall be made to the consultant within 30 (thirty) days after the submission of Advance Security by the Consultant. The advance payment will be set off by the Client in 10 (ten) equal installments against the statements commencing from the 6th month of the Services and thereafter in the 9th and 12th months, and then in the 13th to 19th months until the advance payment has been fully set off.

The advance payment security shall be in local currency, in form of a Bank Guarantee from a Scheduled Bank in India in an amount equal to such advance for the amount in the foreign as well as local currency portion of the advance payment. Such Bank Guarantee shall remain effective until the advance payment has been fully set off.

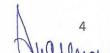
The Governing Body was requested to accord its approval for payment of the advance (in terms of Provision 2 of the Delegation of Financial Powers - Procurement & approval of payment for services), to the Consultant in accordance with the provisions of the Contract.

<u>Decision</u>: The payment of advance to the Project Management Consultant was approved by the Governing Body, subject to the condition that the payment of advanced should be released after the Bank Guarantee (as per the terms of the contract) is received by the Society.

5. Modification/addition of certain Provisions of Operation Manual of the Society.

(a) Modification in delegation of financial powers for sanction of advance to carry out project activities.

The GB, in its meeting held on 25.03.2013 had approved the provisions for Delegation of Administrative and Financial Powers within the Society. However, while releasing the advances to the DMUs for establishment of Central Nurseries (budgeted cost Rs. 31.25 lakhs for each new nursery), it was seen that every release of advance to a DMU for the purpose would have to be placed to the GB for approval. The following modifications in the delegation of financial powers of the Society were, therefore, placed to the Governing Body for approval:

<u>Decision:</u> The modifications of delegation of financial powers of the Society as proposed above are approved. The release of advances of Rs. 31.25 lakhs each, for the establishment of Central Nurseries to 6 (six) DMUs is also approved post-facto.

(b) <u>Modification in desirable qualifications for support staff of Project Management Unit (PMU) and Divisional Management Units (DMUs).</u>

The GB in its meeting held on 25.03.2013 had approved the essential and desirable qualifications of the support staff of PMU and DMU. A proposal for further amendment of the desirable qualifications was placed before the Governing Body for consideration

<u>Decision</u>: The Governing Body considered the whole proposal and approved the proposal with modifications including modifications in the Name of Post and desirable qualification as given in the table:

(c) Addition of provision for procurement through WEBEL & Cooperative Society

Proposal of procurement of office equipments such as Computers, Printers, photocopier etc. through WEBEL was placed to the Governing Body, with reference to Government of West Bengal, Finance Department, and Audit Branch, memorandum No. 3876- F, dated 02.05.2005, on policy for procurement, installation and maintenance of IT product by Govt. Department.

<u>Decision</u>: The procurement method from WEBEL as delineated in GoWB Finance Dept Audit Branch memo no 3876-F dt 02.05.2005 is adopted by the Society and should be included in para (vi) under the provisions of "Methods of Procurement - Direct Order" of Chapter "Procurement" of the "Operation Manual" of the Society.

(d) <u>Inclusion of Provision for vetting of estimates by Superintending Engineer under</u> Alipore Zoo or respective Zilla Parishads.

It was proposed that the (financial) vetting of estimates for Civil works for more than Rs. 3.00 lakhs may be carried out by the Superintending/ Executive Engineer of the Zilla Parishad and also by the Superintending/ Executive Engineer of the Alipore Zoo in addition to the existing govt order of vetting by Superintending/ Executive Engineer of the PWD.

<u>Decision:</u> The financial vetting of estimates for Civil works may be carried out by the Superintending/ Executive Engineers of the Zilla Parishads and Alipore Zoo. The provision may be included as sub-head-"Vetting of Estimates"-under Chapter "Miscellaneous" of the "Operational Manual" of the Society.

(e) <u>Inclusion of provision for publication of various advertisements directly by the Society</u> & Selection of Newspapers for publication of advertisements.

The publication of advertisements by the Society gets delayed if published through I & CA Dept., apparently due to various procedural necessities. Further, the confirmation of publication of the advertisements for Tenders and Notices for Quotations, in the local dailies through the I & CA Deptt. is generally not received and it is also not known as to which Daily has published the advertisement, till it is published and searched. It was therefore proposed that the Society may publish its Notices/Advertisements etc. directly through the National/ Local selected/ approved Newspapers. A list of newspaper was also proposed for



this purpose. It was proposed that the provision may be included as a new sub-head - "Publication"- under Chapter "Miscellaneous" of the "Operation Manual" of the Society.

<u>Decision:</u> The Chief Project Director, after obtaining the rates of publication from I & CA Dept., may advertise in suitable newspaper, depending upon the nature of advertisement and extent of circulation required. The provision may be included as a new sub-head - "Publication"- under Chapter "Miscellaneous" of the "Operation Manual" of the Society.

(f) Further revision in composition of the Governing Body of the Society:

Decision: As against para 2(i) above.

6. Approval for formulation of Heads of Accounts.

The Governing Body (GB), WBFBC Society, in its meeting held on 25th March, 2013, while according approval to Accounting Principles & Procedures (Agenda Item No. 4) (VIII), had directed that "the detailed Heads of Accounts shall be prescribed for the Project by the Chief Project Director, WBFBC Project, with approval of the Governing Body". The detailed Heads of Accounts based on the funds allocated by JICA in various categories as per the Minutes of Discussions (MoD) were placed before the Governing Body for approval.

<u>Decision</u>: The Governing Body approved the detailed Heads of Accounts for the purpose of the project and agreed to incorporate the same in "Accounting Principles & Procedures" approved by the GB in the meeting held on 25th March, 2013. The Heads of Accounts as approved by the GB is annexed as Annexure I.

7. Administrative & Financial approvals.

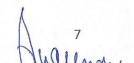
a) Construction of Building at Salt Lake, Kolkata.

The PCCF, HoFF, WB constituted a Committee to oversee the construction of new building at AE-391, Salt Lake, Kolkata, to be constructed under West Bengal Forest & Bio-diversity Conservation Project.

The Committee decided that the architect, M/S D. Subhash & Associates, who was selected through open tender and appointed as Architect for this Project, vide Tender Notice No. 01/GBD of 2010-11, would be allowed to continue as Architect for the above-mentioned Project. The Committee decided that order for full supervision by the Architect should be included in place of partial supervision, as agreed earlier.

The Committee also accepted and approved additional works for which architectural fees is 2.70% of project cost in place of earlier approved 1.95% of project cost.

The recommendation of the Committee regarding revised architectural fees of 2.70% of project cost for specific additional works in place of earlier approved 1.95% of project cost, duly endorsed by the PCCF, HoFF, WB was accepted by the CPD, WBFBC Project, under the powers delegated to him vide Provision No. 13 of Delegation of Financial Power under the Chapter Delegation of Powers. The estimate for the project has been revised from Rs. 1,12,98,988.00 to Rs. 1,22,09,327.57 (Rupees One crore twenty-two lakks nine thousand three hundred twenty-seven & paise fifty-seven) only based on current PWD Schedule. It has



been duly vetted by the Chief Engineer, West Bengal Zoo Authority, Zoological Garden, Alipore.

Decision:

- (i) Financial approval for the revised estimated of Rs. 1,22,09,327.57 (Rupees One crore twenty-two lakks nine thousand three hundred twenty-seven & paise fifty-seven) only for the project is accorded.
- (ii) Chief Project Director is authorized to approve issuance of e-Tender.
- (iii) Chief Project Director should place the results of the tender to GB for acceptance & approval of the same.

b) Construction (extension) of building at Aranya Bhawan, Salt Lake, Kolkata.

The Committee constituted by PCCF, HoFF to oversee the new construction at Salt Lake was also assigned to oversee extension of Aranya Bhawan, Salt Lake, Kolkata, to be constructed under West Bengal Forest & Bio-diversity Conservation Project.

The Committee decided that the architect, M/S D. Subhash & Associates, who was selected through open tender and appointed as Architect for this Project, vide Tender Notice No. 01/GBD of 2010-11, would be allowed to continue as Architect for the above-mentioned Project. The Committee decided that order for full supervision by the Architect should be included in place of partial supervision, as agreed earlier.

The Committee also accepted and approved additional works for which architectural fees is 2.95% of project cost in place of earlier approved 2.20% of project cost.

The recommendation of the Committee regarding revised architectural fees of 2.95% of project cost for specific additional works in place of earlier approved 2.20% of project cost, duly endorsed by the PCCF, HoFF, WB was accepted by the CPD, WBFBC Project, under the powers delegated to him vide Provision No. 13 of Delegation of Financial Power under the Chapter Delegation of Powers. The estimate for the project has been revised from Rs. Rs. 2,34,70,961.00 to Rs. 2,50,23,746.95 (Rupees Two crore fifty lakhs twenty-three thousand seven hundred forty-six & paise ninety-five) only based on current PWD Schedule. It has been duly vetted by the Chief Engineer, West Bengal Zoo Authority, Zoological Garden, Alipore.

Decision:

- (i) Financial approval for the revised estimate of Rs. 2,50,23,746.95 (Rupees Two crore fifty lakhs twenty-three thousand seven hundred forty-six & paise ninety-five) for the project is accorded
- (ii) Chief Project Director is authorized to approve issuance of e-Tender.
- (iii) Chief Project Director should place the results of the tender to GB for acceptance & approval of the same.

8. Administrative & Financial approval for purchase of vehicles & motor-cycles for field staff

The Chief Project Director apprised the Governing Body of the development on this task.



The PCCF, HoFF, WB, constituted a Committee to decide on the model of Motor-cycles & Vehicles with justification for procurement under the WBFBC Project and to decide upon the distribution of the same.

The Committee scanned the technical specifications of different makes of 150 cc class of Motor-cycles as well as Vehicles available in the Indian market. Based on the review of technical specifications, the Committee set a string of technical parameters to select the model of Motor-cycle suitable for forest staff as well as the model of Vehicle. Based on its recommendations another Committee set up by PCCF, HoFF, short listed the models of Motor-cycles and Vehicles. The Committee also suggested that before finally selecting the model, a demonstration by the dealer may be arranged for comparing the features of Motor-cycles. Similarly the specific models of Scorpio and Maruti-SX4, would be finalised on getting the comparison of rates and features of individual models.

The GB was requested to approve the short-listing of models for Motor-cycles and Vehicles and also the mode of procurement of the motor-cycles and vehicles, as detailed above. The financial approval for Procurement would be sought in due course.

<u>Decision:</u> After completion of all the procedures and formalities for selection of Motor-cycles and Vehicles, the Committee should come up with specific recommendations, to be placed in the Governing Body meeting.

9. Approval for hiring of office accommodation for Project Management Unit (PMU).

As decided in the GB meeting held on 6th August, 2012, the Chief Project Director, WBFBC Project, explored the possibilities of setting of office of PMU in the building being constructed by West Bengal Forest Development Corporation Ltd. (WBFDCL) and also alternative accommodations near about Aranya Bhavan. The Managing Director, West Bengal Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd., agreed to allot an area of about 2,140 sq.ft. in Building No. 2 of the premises at LB-2, Sector-III, Salt Lake, at a monthly rate of Rs. 18.00 per sq.ft. with an increase of 10% on rate for each subsequent year. The offer of the MD, West Bengal Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd., was accepted by the Chief Project Director, WBFBC Project, with the concurrence of the Chairperson of Governing Body, and the office space has been hired at monthly rate of Rs. 38,520.00 (Rupees Thirty-eight thousand five hundred twenty) only per month, with effect from 1st May, 2013. The office of the PMU is expected to be functional from 1st week of September, 2013, at the new location. The GB was requested to ratify the action for hiring the office space with effect from 1st May, 2013.

<u>Decision</u>: The hiring of office space (2140 sft) in the premise of West Bengal Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd at Salt Lake at the monthly rate of Rs 18.00 per sft with an increase of 10% on rate for each subsequent year, is approved. The approval will be effective from 1st May, 2013

10. Approval for engagement of retired personnel on contract basis for Project Management Unit (PMU).

The proposal for creation of posts for establishment of PMU within the Society is long-pending and it may take some further procedural time. The PMU is being run with officers (3 at present), holding responsibilities of Chief Project Director, Project Director (Finance)



and Addl. Project Director (Implementation), in addition to their own present assignments. There is no support staff, other than one Range Officer, who has also been assigned duties in PMU in addition to his own present duties. The additional support is drawn in the form of PA of the Addl. PCCF, Finance. This necessitates the engagement of personnel to take up the work-load of the PMU.

The GB, in its meeting, held on 25.03.2013, has approved recruitment of personnel by the Society through Service Provider under the Provision "Support Staff of PMU and DMU" of the Chapter "Recruitment and Service Rules." Retired Govt. official can be engaged in the Society on contractual basis with the approval of GB and shall be paid consolidated remuneration subject to the guidelines of the Finance Department regarding re-employment of retired Govt. personnel.

Accordingly the Chief Project Director placed before the GB the proposal of engagement of Accounts Officer (1), Accountant (1), Office Asst (2) and Joint P.D (HRD/Extension) (1) with consolidated remuneration ranging from Rs. 15000/- to Rs. 30000/- per month. The details of terms & conditions for engagement of the above personnel were also presented before the GB in Annexure-IV of the Agenda notes.

The GB was requested to accord the approval for engagement of retired personnel on contract basis so that the notice of the same may be issued at the earliest.

Decision:

(i) Approval accorded for engagement of retired personnel on contract basis as detailed below:

- (ii) PMU is authorized to engage retired personnel on contract basis as approved in (i) above inviting applications through publication of notice.
- (iii) The maximum age of the candidates should not exceed 64 years. Necessary correction should be made in the draft Notice for Engagement of Contractual Staff. The corrected Notice for Engagement of Contractual Staff is annexed as Annexure II.

11. Approval for engagement of contractual staff through Service Provider for Divisional Management Units (DMUs).

The MoD provides that PMU will require induction of skilled supporting staff to facilitate project activities and semi-skilled supporting staff to work as accountant, computer operator and office assistant.

The GB, in its meeting, held on 25.03.2013, has approved recruitment of personnel - 6 for the PMU and 81 for the DMUs under various categories - by the Society through Service Provider under the Provision "Support Staff of PMU and DMU" of the Chapter "Recruitment and Service Rules."

It was proposed that the engagement of Service Provider may be made Circle-wise as allotted and shown in the Agenda note, on the basis of the uniform terms & conditions drawn for this purpose. The draft of terms & conditions for engagement of the above personnel were placed in Annexure-V to the Agenda Notes. Approval of the draft terms and conditions of engagement and also the distribution of the personnel as tabulated in Annexure V were requested.

Decision:

- (i) The draft terms and conditions of engagement of service provider for support staff of PMU/DMU are approved. The draft terms and conditions of engagement of service provider for support staff is annexed as **Annexure III**.
- (ii) Tender may be floated by the respective Circles for engaging service provider against the distribution of support staff approved by the GB.
- (iii) The distribution of the support staff DMU wise as approved is annexed as Annexure IV. Out of 87(total position is 6+81=87), 67 positions have been distributed and approved. The remaining positions will be allotted to the proposed new DMUs or to existing DMUs in future, with approval of GB.

12. Approval for Constitution of new Divisional Management Units (DMU).

As per the State Government's Resolution no. 2623-For/G/6M-38/12 dated 21.12.2012, Divisional Management Units (DMUs) and Field Management Units (FMUs) would be established under the Society. Accordingly, the GB was informed that 32 DMUs have been created within the office of Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) to function as field unit of the Society and to implement the activities of the WBFBC Project in the Division vide the Society's notification no. 114/WBFBCP/7-1/13 dated 09.04.2013. Also the accounts of 26 (twenty-six) DMUs have been opened.

It was placed before the GB that for monitoring of the plantations raised under the Project, establishment of DMUs under Monitoring North Division and Monitoring South Division, and for establishment of Central Nurseries and supplying seedlings to Territorial Divisions, establishment of DMUs under Silviculture (North), Silviculture (Hills) and Silviculture (South) divisions need to be done

Decision:

- (i) DMUs for Monitoring Divisions and Silviculture Divisions need not be constituted.
- (ii) PMU should transfer fund to DFO Monitoring (North) and DFO Monitoring (South) for the purpose of monitoring of plantations under the Project.
- (iii) The Monitoring wing should be requested to prepare the Monitoring Plan for the purpose.
- (iv) Similarly, PMU should transfer funds to the DFOs of the three Silviculture Divisions against sanctioned works under the Project, viz: development of nursery protocol for identified species and other works.

(v) The Silviculture Divisions should not be involved in the activity of production of seedlings for the Territorial Divisions under the Project and should concentrate on Project works related to the Research.

13. Approval for selection of second batch of FPCs.

The selection of FPCs/EDCs as per the approved criteria for the 1st batch has been carried out and approved by the GB in its meeting held on 25.03.2013.

It was seen that the data on FPCs was revised and updated by a number of DMUs in the second stage of selection, leading to discrepancies in scores secured by the FPCs already selected in the first batch. This has also resulted in either elimination or change in ranking of a few FPCs in a Division. The scores secured by an individual FPC in the final process have been taken as final. The combined list of 280 FPCs (230 in South Bengal and 50 in North Bengal) was placed before the GB in Annexure-VI to the Agenda notes for approval.

<u>Decision:</u> The list of 280 FPCs - 230 in South Bengal and 50 in North Bengal - is approved. The list of the approved FPCs is annexed as **Annexure V**.

14. Approval for holding HPC meeting.

The Govt. of West Bengal vide its Notification No. 1048-For, dated 09.05.2012, has constituted the High-power Committee for the purpose of the implementation on the WBFBC Project. The HPC is chaired by the Chief Secretary. Since the HPC is supposed to meet at least once a year, it was felt necessary that a meeting should be convened at the earliest convenience of the Chairperson of the HPC. The preferable date will be in the 2nd week of September, 2013. Governing Body was requested to approve the proposal.

<u>Decision</u>: The proposal of convening the HPC meeting is approved. The Agenda notes may be prepared by the Chief Project Director and circulated to the members beforehand.

15. Approval for Annual Plan and Budget for the year 2013-14.

The Society received Rs. 1.3525 crores in the last week of March, 2013. As such no utilization could be made during the FY 2012-13.

During FY 2013-14, against budget provision of Rs. 55.08 crores for the project, Rs. 41.31 crores (75% of allotted funds) have been received by the Society.

- 3. To provide manpower of such quality, who would be competent to handle the nature and load of work of the DMUs described in para 2.4 and subject to terms & conditions laid down in paragraph 2.4.2.
- 4. The period for which the services are to be provided is equivalent to the Project duration. However, the contract with the successful bidder will be initially for a period of one year only, which may be extended annually, based on the delivery of services to the satisfaction of PMU.

2.5. Cost of the Tender Document

2.6. Eligibility Criteria

- **2.6.1**. The intending tenderers should have Income Tax PAN, Professional Tax Registration number, Service Tax Registration number, PF Establishment Code, ESI Registration Number and license issued by the Labour Commissioner, Govt. of West Bengal under the Contract Labour (R & A) Act, 1970.
- **2.6.2** The prospective Agency should have experience of implementation, during the last 5 years, of at least two similar works of providing the services of skilled and semi-skilled manpower for

2.8.2 Technical Bid

- c. The technical bid must not contain any pricing information.
- d. In submitting additional information, the same may be marked as Supplementary to the required response. If the bidder wishes to propose additional services (or enhanced levels of services) beyond the scope of this tender document, the proposal must include a description of such services as a separate attachment to the proposal.
- e. The address and contact number(s) of the Bidder should be clearly written on the cover.

2.8.3 Financial Bid

- a. The Financial Bid as prescribed in the Tender (Annexure II) should be filled up and sealed along with enclosures in a separate cover super-scribed as "Tender Notice No. XX/WBFBCP/XX Circle of 2013-14 Financial Bid Engagement of Agency to provide Skilled/Semi-skilled workers".

THE TENDERS IN SINGLE SEALED COVER CONTAINING TWO SEPARATE SEALED COVERS FOR TECHNICAL BID AND FINANCIAL BID SHOULD BE XXXXXXX, ADDRESSED TO SHRI CHIEF CONSERVATOR FORESTS/CONSERVATOR OF FORESTS, YYY CIRCLE, WEST BENGAL, XXXXXXXXXXXXXX (address). THE TENDERS DELIVERED BY HAND SHOULD BE DELIVERED INTO THE TENDER BOX OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF CONSERVATOR OF FORESTS/CONSERVATOR OF FORESTS, YYY CIRCLE, WEST TENDERS DELIVERED THROUGH COURIER /POST SHOULD REACH ADDRESSEE BY 15:00 HOURS OF 2013.
- **2.9.2** The tenders received after the due date and time specified or unsealed or incomplete or by facsimile or email will be summarily rejected.

2.10 Period of Validity of Proposals

- a. The offer submitted by the bidder <u>shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the last date of submission of the tender.</u> A proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected as non-responsive.
- b. In exceptional circumstances, the Society may solicit the bidder's consent for an extension of the validity period. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing (or by fax or email).

2.11. Late Proposals

2.12 Tenders can be submitted on or before the due date and time specified in the Tender. No proposal will be received at the office the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, after the specified time.

2.13 Proposal Preparation Costs

The bidder is responsible for all costs incurred in connection with participation in this process, including, but not limited to, costs incurred in conduct of informative and other diligence activities, participation in meetings/discussions/presentations, preparation of proposal, in providing any additional information required by the Society to facilitate the evaluation process, and in negotiating a definitive Service Agreement or all such activities related to the bid process.

2.14 Right to Terminate the Process

- **2.14.1** The right of final acceptance of the tender is entirely vested with the West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Society, which reserves the right to accept or reject any or all of the tenders in full or in parts without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- **2.14.2** There is no obligation on the part of the Chief Conservator of Forests XXX Circle/Conservator of Forests XXX Circle or Chief Project Director, West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Project or the Society to communicate with rejected Bidders.



2.14.3. The successful Agency will be bound by the details furnished by it to the tender inviting authority while submitting the tender or at subsequent stage. In case any of such documents furnished by the Agency is found to be false at any stage, it would be deemed to be a breach of terms of contract making the Agency liable for legal action besides termination of contract.

2.15. Refund of Earnest Money Deposit

2.15.1. The EMD would be refunded to all unsuccessful bidders within 60 days from the final publication of the results, without any interests. The EMD of the successful bidder would be released only after fulfillment of the requirement of Performance Guarantee with reference to the deliverables and time frame specified.

2.16. Bid Opening

- **2.16.1** The Technical Bids will be opened at 15:00 hours of, 2013 by the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, or his authorized officer, at YYYYY (address), in presence of such of those Bidders or their authorized representatives who may be present at the time of opening.
- 2.16.2 The Technical Bids will be evaluated as per the evaluation criteria specified in the Tender. The list of technically qualified Bidders will be prepared by Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, or his authorized representative and displayed on the Notice Board in XXXX (address) and the websites by, 2013.

2.17. Tender Rejection Criteria

- **2.17.1** The tenders with the Technical Bid not containing Tender Document cost and/or EMD amount will be summarily rejected.
- **2.17.2**. Tenders not submitted in the form specified as per the format given in this Tender document (Annexure I and Annexure II) will be summarily rejected.
- **2.17.3** Tenders with incomplete information, subjective and conditional offers as well as partial offers will be liable for rejection.
- **2.17.4** Tenders with variance/contradiction between Technical Bid and Financial Bid will be liable for rejection. If the offer does not meet the tender requirements, the Society, through Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, reserves the right to reject any or all the tenders without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- **2.17.5** Tenders submitted without the enclosures to prove the Bidder's specific experience in similar assignment will be liable for rejection.
- **2.17.6** Tenders submitted without audited financial statements of the Bidder are liable for rejection.



- **2.17.7** In addition to the above rejection criteria, if there is non-compliance of any of the clauses of this Tender Document, the Tenders are liable for rejection.
- **2.17.8** Incomplete bid documents will be treated as non-responsive offer and the tender is liable for rejection.

3. BID EVALUATION PROCESS

Evaluation of Bid will be on cost, with a minimum Technical Qualification.

3.1. Evaluation of Technical Bids

The Technical Bid will be examined by a Technical Committee to be constituted by Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, on the basis of the evaluation criteria specified in the Tender.

3.2 The details provided in the Technical Bid will be taken as reference for evaluation.

3.3. Technical Bid Evaluation Criteria:

- a) Should have minimum specified experience in the field of providing skilled and semiskilled manpower service in various organizations. Refer para XXX

The bidders, who qualify in the Technical evaluation, will be considered for the evaluation in the financial process.

3.4. Evaluation of Financial bids

- a. The Financial Bids of only the technically qualified bidders will be evaluated as per the evaluation criteria mentioned below. Financial Bids of bidders who do not qualify technically, will not be opened.
- b. Only the Fixed Price given in the Financial Bid shall be considered for evaluation.
- c. All eligible Bidders will be ranked in ascending order (i.e.) the Bidder who quoted the lowest Value (L1) will be ranked first and so on.

4. AWARD OF CONTRACT

4.1. Letter of Acceptance

After the evaluation of the bids and ranking, a Letter of Acceptance of tender will be issued to the successful Bidder by the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, on receipt of the concurrence of the Society.

4.2. Forfeiture of EMD

If the successful Bidder fails to act according to the tender conditions or backs out after his tender has been accepted, his EMD will be forfeited to the Society. In this event, the offer will be made to the next ranked Bidder.

4.3. Signing of Contract

- a. The successful Bidder should execute an Agreement for the fulfillment of the contract with the Society at the time of execution within 15 days from the date of receipt of the Letter of acceptance issued by the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, If the same is not executed within 15 days from the date of receipt of Letter of Acceptance, the EMD of the Bidder will be forfeited and their tender will be held as non-responsive.
- b. The expenses incidental to the execution of the Agreement are to be borne by the successful Bidder.
- c. The agreement will initially be signed for a period of one year to be subsequently renewed at the completion of the year successfully to the satisfaction of the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal.

4.4. Performance Bank Guarantee

- a. The successful bidder shall at his own expense deposit with the Society, within 15 days from the date of receipt of the letter of acceptance, issued by the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, on behalf of the Society, or prior to signing of the contract, whichever is earlier, an unconditional and irrevocable Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) from a scheduled bank, payable on demand, for the due performance and fulfillment of the contract by the bidder.
- b. This Performance Bank Guarantee will be for an amount equivalent to 5% of contract value. All incidental charges whatsoever such as premium; commission etc. with respect to the performance bank guarantee shall be borne by the bidder. The Bank Guarantee shall be valid initially for a period of one year from the date of signing of contract, which may have to be extended on extension of the contract. If the successful Bidder fails to furnish the bank guarantee within the above said period, the EMD remitted by him will be forfeited to the Society and his tender will be held void. The PBG furnished by the successful Bidder in respect of his tender, will be returned to him at the end of the contract period subject to satisfactory performance, to be evaluated by the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal.
- c. If the Bidder fails to act according to the tender conditions or backs out when his tender is accepted, his PBG mentioned above will also be forfeited to the Society.

4.5. Issue of Work Order

After the execution of the agreements specified in the Tender Document and after receipt of the PBG, the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, on behalf of the Society, will issue the formal work order to the successful bidder within 15 days.

4.6. Execution of Work Order

The successful bidder should nominate and intimate to the Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal, the name of an authorized person from his side, specifically to handle the contractual obligations. The successful Bidder should ensure that the authorized person is fully familiarized with the terms and conditions of the Tender, Scope of Work and the Guidelines.

4.7. Assigning of Tender whole or in part

The successful Bidder shall not assign or make over the contract, the benefit or burden thereof to any other person or persons or body corporate. He shall not underlet or sublet to any person(s) or body corporate for the execution of the contract or any part thereof.

4.8. Termination of Contract

The Chief Conservator of Forests/Conservator of Forests, YYY Circle, West Bengal/DMU/Society reserves the right to terminate the contract with the successful service provider, if it finds the work unsatisfactory, at any stage during the contract period, by giving a notice of fifteen (15) days. The service provider shall then be paid for the work completed, as per the rates quoted, till that stage of the assignment, as part of response to this tender document. Security Deposit will however be forfeited.

4.9. Force Majeure

The Service Provider shall not be considered in default, if delay in delivery occurs due to causes beyond his control such as acts of God, natural calamities, civil wars, fire, strike, frost, floods, riot and acts of unsurpassed power. In the event of delay due to such causes, the contract may be extended for a length of time equal to the period of force majeure or at the option of West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Society, it may be cancelled. Such cancellation would be without any liability whatsoever on the part of Society.

5. OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a. Contract will be made between the Society and the successful Agency on agency basis and not on the basis of engagement of individuals to the DMU of the Society.
- b. Agency shall agree to comply with all the provisions of this Tender Document, which shall form the part of the contract.
- c. In case of any dispute, the matter will be referred to an Arbitrator under "Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996". The arbitration shall be held in Jalpaiguri/Bankura/Kolkata (name of the district HQ of the Circle) only and the Courts at Jalpaiguri/Bankura/Kolkata (name of the district HQ of the Circle) only shall have jurisdiction in relation thereto.
