Minutes of Meeting of the 3rd meeting of the High Powered Committee

The 3rd meeting of the High Powered Committee (HPC) was held on 21st March, 2016 in the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall (13th Floor) at Nabanna.

The meeting was chaired by Shri B. Banerjee, IAS, Chief Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal. The other members present are listed below.

The agenda wise discussion and the decisions / observations on each of the agenda are delineated below.

Agenda item no 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the 2nd meeting held on 01.12.2014

No communication on the minutes of the 2nd meeting has been received from any of the members.

<u>Decision</u>: The minutes of the 2nd Meeting held on 01.12.2014 stands confirmed.

Agenda item no 2: Action Taken Report on the resolutions of the 2nd meeting

The action taken report which is presented in Annexure –I of the Agenda Note of the 3rd meeting was discussed in details. The following points of the Action Taken Report were highlighted and deliberated upon.

Point no. 2 (ii) of the ATR of 2nd meeting: Security Issues of LWE Blocks:

The members were apprised and assured that works of the project are going on in the LWE blocks of Bankura, Purulia and Medinipur without any hindrance so far.

Point no. 2 (iii) of the ATR of 2nd meeting: Presentation of the Status Report:

- (a) The project authorities apprised the members that the copies of the microplans of FPC/EDCs totalling 600 nos., will be sent to the P&R Dept., the BCW Dept. and the concerned District Magistrates in phases.
- (b) It was clarified that the expenditure figures of 2014-15 of Rs. 22.54 Crores and cumulative expenditure till February 2016 of Rs. 57.02 Crores include Non-grant fund (i.e; INR equivalent of USD payment of consultant) also.

<u>Point No.(iv)</u> of the ATR of 2nd meeting : Procurement of additional vehicles and motor cycle under the Project :

- (a) A correction was made by Chief Project Director by informing that instead of the term Department of Expenditure mentioned in the 'Action Taken' column of the ATR, it should be read as Department of Economic Affairs.
- (b) While informing the members that the proposal of additional vehicle procurement has been accepted in principle by the Mid Term Review (MTR) team of JICA, the Chief Project Director also informed the members that very recently the MoEFCC, Govt of India, has also agreed with all the MTR proposals and forwarded the matter to the Dept of Economic Affairs, Gol for concurrence.

Decision / Observation:

The action taken report was deliberated upon and approved by the members of the HPC.

Agenda Item No. 3: Presentation of Status Report

The Status of the Project given in Annexure – II of the Agenda notes was presented before the members by a power point presentation, with relevant photographs. The following points were raised by the Chairperson and discussed:-

- (i) Loan Interest, Dates and Period of Project :
 - It was informed by project authorities that the Interest on loan is @ 0.65% on works and 0.1% on Consultancy; the loan period is 10 yrs after date of effectuation, which is 24.8.2012 and the project period is from 2012-13 to 2019-20 (8 yrs). The Finance Secretary informed that the total interest rate chargeable under JICA scheme would work out to 7-8% over a period of time.
- (ii) Procedure of microplan preparation:

The microplans have been prepared by Participatory Rural Appraisal Methods with the assistance of the Project Management Consultants, Project authority and the field level staff at DMU and FMU.

(iii) The basic objectives of the Project :

It was apprised by the project authority that the basic objective is to expand green cover and simultaneously conserve biodiversity. However, unlike other projects the concept of Central Nurseries and Quality Planting Material (QPM) based on Root trainer technology has been introduced. It was also informed that Afforestation activities constituted approx. 39% of the reimbursable cost, which is the largest component.

(iv) Delay in Project implementation:

On being asked about the delay of project implementation the Forest Secretary informed that the project started 18 months late, because of various reasons including late constitution of the Project Mgmt. Unit (PMU), Selection of Consultants and preparation of microplans.

- (v) Afforestation including establishment of Central Nurseries:
 - (a) The PCCF (HoFF) observed that the main component of project i.e. afforestation will be over by the next 2-3 years. Therefore the major project expenditure is expected to be over within the prescribed time limit.
 - (b) The techniques used in developing QPM through root trainers was also explained by the Chief Project Director which was appreciated by the Chief Secretary as the survivability and the quality of the plantation stock has improved. It was mentioned that owing to very high survival percentage (>95%) in the 1st year, the seedling raised in Central Nurseries could be brought down @ 2000 per ha. to 1800 per ha. Also the cost of production of seedling in nursery could be reduced.

It was explained that the growing medium being used in this technology is compost prepared from weeds, straw etc. and not soil. For this purpose lot of practical training classes for the field staff has been organized by the PMU. Member from the P&RD Dept. requested for imparting training to the panchayat members and identified SHG groups with regard to composting and root trainer technology.

The members were also apprised by the Chief Project Director that the Central nurseries created are capital intensive assets and will be used to raise QPM not only for JICA project but for all schemes. To this issue it was also added that the PCCF (HoFF) has already taken a decision to do away with the field nursery and to depend on Central Nursery concept of raising seedlings for all schemes.

(c) The Chief Secretary observed that, it may be explored whether plantation in panchayat and others non-forest land (Social Forestry) could be done by improved technology and models of plantation. He observed that in urban / municipal areas, the major roads, including the newly constructed roads, may be covered by Avenue plantation, following the guidelines of Forest Dept.

(vi) Online Plantation Journal:

The project authorities explained that online plantation journal (e-format) has been developed under the project for easy data retrieval, analyses and decision making on plantations being undertaken under all schemes in the State. This will be a good monitoring tool also. This was appreciated by the members present.

Decision:

- The Status Report was approved by the members of the HPC.
- (ii) Training on composting and root trainer technology will be organised by the project authorities on specific request from P& RD Dept.
- (iii) The guidelines of avenue planting of Forest Dept. should be communicated with the Municipal Corporations and Municipalities

Agenda item no 4: Convergence of funding of schemes proposed under JFMC based microplans

It was explained that the project provides for Rs. 31.20 crores under Community Development component, i.e; only 9.10% of the reimbursable cost of the project. Therefore, the average fund allocation for each of the 600 FPC/EDCs would be Rs. 5.20 lakhs. Since this was meagre compared to the programmes suggested in the microplans, convergence of funding from the respective districts could be done to meet up the cost of the programmes to a large extent. It was proposed that:

- (a) The copies of microplans will be sent to the respective district authorities shortly;
- (b) The issue of convergence by pooling funds under various schemes by the district authority may be agreed to and an advisory may be issued to the district authorities accordingly

Decision:

- (i) Funding of works proposed in the microplans by the district authority under various schemes was agreed upon in principle.
- (ii) A centralised advisory in this regard can be issued.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.
